## C3SC News

- **'Grangetown Wellbeing Web Portal' Launch!**

[Grangetown Wellbeing Web Portal](#) was launched this week at Cardiff Third Sector Council's Annual General Meeting. The Web Portal has been developed with the wellbeing of local community groups and residents in mind. It is the result of a successful partnership between C3SC, Cardiff University Community Gateway Programme and local community groups involved in the Wellbeing in Action pilot. It supports local community groups to coordinate community action for wellbeing and better connect with local residents. Local groups are at the heart of their communities and are key contributors in tackling loneliness and social isolation; supporting these groups to grow and work together to improve local Community action is what C3SC is all about.

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- **Youth Led Grant**

The **Youth Led Grant** awards are small grants allocated **by young people to other young people** for community action projects that encourage youth volunteering.

There is a small pot of **£4000.00** available which we would like to share across 3 or 4 youth projects.

**Background Information about the Cardiff Youth Led Grant Award:**

The purpose of the grant is to identify ways to engage more young people in volunteering from disadvantaged and under-represented communities. The **Cardiff Youth Led Grant** panel is made up of 9 young people aged 14-25 who all live in Cardiff and are from diverse backgrounds with a variety of skills and experiences. The CYLG panel is funded by the Welsh Government and WCVA. The CYLG panel members are supported by Cardiff Third Sector Council (C3SC) to run their activities and make decisions about the funding. The aim of the funding is to help young people aged 14-25 to be more involved in their local community through volunteering.

**Who can apply for the grant?**

- Any project that is based in Cardiff and will encourage young people who live in Cardiff to get involved.
- Any projects that will empower and enable young people aged 14-25 years old to volunteer – either directly with the project or as a direct result of the project. (*The volunteering must occur during the lifetime of the project*).
- Projects must also have a wider community benefit.

Applicants must be voluntary or community organisations that are legally constituted.

Applicants must also have a bank account in the name of the organisation, which requires at least two signatures.

There is no minimum or maximum amount that can be applied for, but the total award available is £4000.00.

Projects or groups that have applied before can reapply (whether or not they were successful in previous years) but please ensure your ideas are in line with this year's criteria.

- **Heart of the Community Fund**

**The Virgin Money Foundation is on a mission to support community regeneration by backing people who can make big changes happen locally.** They love helping local communities thrive so every two months, they're giving three local charities the chance to win £1,000 – with awards of £500 and £250 for the two runners-up. - **EYST Wales Routes to Public Life— Mentoring Scheme, February to July 2019**

Would you like to get more involved in public life and have an impact on the decisions that are made that affect you and your communities?

As part of the All Wales BAME (Black, Asian and ethnic minority) Engagement Programme, EYST Wales is offering a scheme for ethnic minority/BAME people to develop political skills and increase their impact in public life. The scheme, which will run from February to July 2019, will include:

- 1-1 mentoring with highly influential people;
- Bespoke training sessions at Welsh Government locations;
- A trip to UK Houses of Parliament;
- Optional opportunity to help organise or contribute to EYST's annual conference observing the UN Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination.

More than 25 influential “high-flyers” have already agreed to be mentors, including Vaughn Gething (AM, Cabinet Minister for Health & Social Care); Sheila Hendrickson-Brown (Chief Executive, Cardiff Third Sector Council); Professor Emmanuel Ogbonna (Cardiff University Business School); Ian Lucas (MP) and Tonia Antoniazzi (MP) to name a few.

EYST Wales invites applications from BAME people who have a clear interest in politics and/or public life and a commitment to their own and other's development. We aim to match mentees with mentors who have similar interests and come from the same geographic area.

You may remember an event earlier this year called Heads Up which featured an interview and Q&A session on the subject of leadership with the former Welsh minister Sue Essex.

## Third Sector News and Events

- **Review of Services for Homeless People in Cardiff with Complex Needs— Invitation to submit research proposal**

The number of people rough sleeping in Cardiff has approximately doubled since 2014. Many service users have extremely complex needs, often with a tri-morbid combination of physical ill health with mental ill health and drug and/or alcohol misuse, they lack social support and are unwilling to access services.

During 2017 the quarterly average number of rough sleepers was consistently above 60 individuals, peaking at over 80 during the months of September/October. During the first quarter of 2018 the average continues to be over 60. The main support needs identified were Substance Misuse with Mental Health as secondary need, Mental Health, Alcohol and Learning Disability.

Cardiff has a wide range of homeless hostels and supported accommodation provision, and longstanding partnerships with the third sector and housing associations. However, the high numbers of people who are currently rough sleeping, and repeatedly returning to provision, indicates that our current model of service delivery may not be wholly effective in meeting the range of needs.

Cardiff Council subsequently wishes to commission a review of the current accommodation and support arrangements for adults who are either sleeping rough, or living in homeless hostels in Cardiff.

- **Cardiff and Vale Advocacy Gateway (CVAG)**

Intended to be the first port of call, this free telephone helpline can be contacted on 0808 801 0577 for advocacy-related information, advice and assistance. CVAG is open Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm. It is staffed by a highly skilled professional team of Helpline Advisor Advocates.

The service is available to residents aged over 18 who may need help to have their views heard, be in control and/or understand their options in relation to services they are receiving, or think they may need, around social care support. Carers and practitioners can also contact the service if they have any concerns about an individual who receives the above. Other important partners in this development are Age Connects, Advocacy Matters (Wales) and Diverse Cymru.
